


Behind the screen with the golden spoon Charles was anointed on his head, chest and hands


So why hide this? Such actions invite speculation, especially knowing they are part of the 13 bloodline families and for centuries involved at the highest level of Freemasonry.


Buddhist, Hinds, Muslim, Jew, Russian orthordox & Sikh falth leaders took part in various parts of the coronation.
