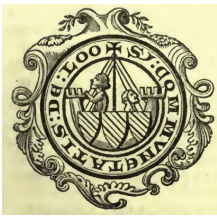

set foot in Cornwall?*

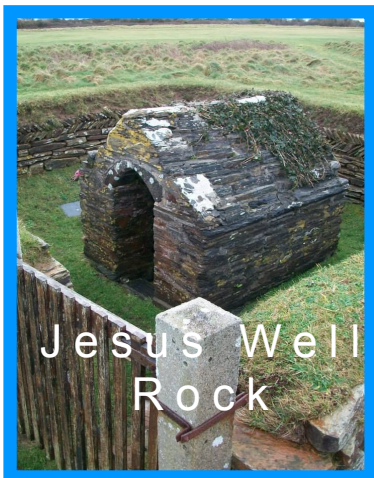


DAY 1

We will visit East Cornwall.

Firstly we will go to the fishing port of Looe, and see Looe Island in the distance. The coat of arms depicts two holy men, one a boy, the other, an older man in a boat. Ancient stories say that they are Yahusha and Joseph of Arimathea.

Then we go to the north coast and visit the “Jesus Well” a freshwater spring close to the village of Rock, which is also where David Cameron, some Rothschilds, and some of the Aster family reside. The ancient church of St. Enedoc nestles in the sand dunes close by. It was buried in sand for several centuries. The 20th century Poet Laureate, John Betjeman’s grave is situated in the churchyard. We will continue on to St Endellion where it is said that the gospel first came into Cornwall and is related to the ancient Kings of Wales.



DAY 2

We will be travelling down West Cornwall. Firstly, visiting St Just in Roseland a 13th century church, where it was reported that Yahusha and Joseph of Arimathea landed when they came to Cornwall.

We will continue on to Ding Dong Mine reportedly the oldest known tin mine in Cornwall. Possibly this mine is where King Solomon sourced his tin from to make ore for the bronze for the Temple.

We will then move on to an ancient village site reported to have its origins dating back over 2000 years and in all probability a trading site for tin. If time permits, we will see St Michael's Mount near Penzance and round off the day with either Fish and Chips or Cornish Pasty and Chips.

A JOURNEY OF DISCOVERY

Cornwall has long been associated with the “lands afar off” alluded to in Scripture. The ancient dots are slowly being revealed to paint an amazing picture of how the truth spread to Great Britain.

LOOE AND SITES IN EAST CORNWALL

Visit picturesque Looe with its quaint streets and rich history; also see the “Jesus Well” at St. Enedoc near Rock and visit the historic St. Endellion.

THE ROSELAND PENINSULAR

Rich in ancient history and legend, this beautiful peninsular has long been mooted as a landing place for Joseph of Arimathea.

DING DONG MINES AND SURROUNDING ANCIENT STONES

These ancient tin mines are surrounded by stones including Lanyon Quoit and Mên-an-Tol. It is reputed that tin from this mine was shipped to the middle-east in the times of King Solomon and possibly before.
